# The Innovation Process

Hello to all and thanks to the California Bowling Writers for allowing me to contribute some technical advice to this publication. I am Steve Kloempken of Storm Products, Inc., and I would like to discuss

how a bowling ball moves from concept to a finished good.

I am often asked, "How does Storm design a bowling ball?" As you might imagine, there are numerous steps involved in developing a new product. To illustrate this process, let us look at what transpired in the development of our popular PhysiX™ ball.

Looking to the conception of the PhysiX, we needed a ball that rolled heavy for today's slicker oils and matched-up on patterns which require a more aggressive line to break point and back to the pocket. The new highly-dynamic asymmetrical Atomic™ Core allows for that massive entry angle that's so popular in the Storm Premier™ Line.

Now that we have decided on a specific core or weight block performance, the next step is to select the coverstock.

Our options are as follows: nanotechnology, reactive (mild or aggressive) or urethane,

and it can be made with either a pearlized or solid blend, or even a hybrid which combined the two.

For the PhysiX, we selected an aggressive NRG™ hybrid shell that utilizes nanotechnology to maximize performance from the foul line to the head pin. In deciding whether to use nanotechnology, we looked at how much friction we wanted to get in the midlane. Since we were looking for more performance we chose the strong option which has the highest surface roughness. We wanted to maximize the friction in oil, so we immediately eliminated a pearl cover. So, testing options included both a solid and a hybrid version, with the hybrid outshining the other for the desired shot shape with this release.

The finishing touch was to determine the proper surface preparation. With the low RG design and hybrid shell, we opted for a 3000-grit matte surface for medium traction. Remember though that you can adjust the surface at any time to better match your style and lane conditions!

She also makes great cupcakes for our bake sales.

As bowlers began to arrive, they enjoyed interacting with both the clients and their service dogs, and the Operation Freedom Paws clients were more than happy to answer their questions, and let them pet their canine companion after they gave them permission to do so.

There were raffle prizes, including a bowling ball donated by Get on Track Pro Shop at Morgan Hill Bowl, as well as 4 tickets to the Monterey Bay Aquarium, valued at \$180, a San Jose Sharks package, valued at \$160, a Wine Lovers Basket, and 2 \$50 gift cards from the Old City Hall Restaurant in Gilroy. Len Nicholson (Phantom) donated 6 of his numbered and autographed books, "My Personal Memories and Stories of the PBA Hall of Famers", Morgan Hill Bowl donated a gift certificate for 2 free hours of bowling and shoe rental for 4, and there was also a gift certificate for 1 free hour of bocce & 1 free hour of billiards for 4 at Troy's Bocce & Wine Bar which is located at Morgan Hill Bowl. Of course there were many more raffle prizes to be won, as well as cash if you bought 50/50 tickets, and there were brackets for the tournament bowlers.

Although the turnout was smaller than we hoped for, everyone that participated had a great time while helping raise \$3,600 for Operation Freedom Paws, a 501(c) 3 non-profit organization started by Mary Cortani in January 2010. Donations allow OFP, at no cost to their clients, to train their clients to train their own service dogs over a 48 week training period. This unique opportunity enables the client to feel safe and secure, and to manage their day-to-day lives. The very special therapeutic canine-human relationship helps them get back out in their communities and begin to view their future with renewed hope, as they become "Four Paws, Two Feet, One Team" as a service dog team. ### Transition Planned for Eldorado Management Team

Eldorado Resorts' board of directors has approved an executive management transition to position the company for its next phase of growth.


Effective Jan. 1, 2019, Tom Reeg, who currently serves as the company's president and chief financial officer, will assume the role of CEO. Gary Carano, the company's current chairman and CEO, has been appointed to the new role of executive chairman.

Among other things, Carano will assist the board and the CEO with regard to a wide variety of strategic matters, including the company's long-term initiatives to maximize its customer-facing amenities and pursue additional acquisition opportunities.

Anthony Carano will assume the role of president and remain chief operating officer. The company has commenced a search for a new CFO.

Members of the Carano family were strong backers of the construction of the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, which is located one block from three Eldorado properties in the downtown district.

Eldorado Resorts is investing more than \$100 million in facility enhancements to those properties - Eldorado Reno, Silver Legacy and Circus Circus Reno - as part of a three-year master plan. The three connected properties, now spanning six contiguous city blocks, will see more than 4,100 guest rooms renovated, new restaurant concepts introduced, and resort amenities added, including a full-service luxury spa.



### Bob Johnson to Hall

Bob Johnson, who began his journey into bowling journalism at age 15, is the only person in the bowling family to serve as editor of five national bowling magazines, winning 75 national writing awards for his news, feature and editorial compositions, many of which directly involved the PBA.

Currently senior editor of *Bowlers Journal International* and editor of *Bowling Center Management* and *Bowling Entertainment Center* magazines, he is a recipient of both the International Bowling Media Association's Luby Hall of Fame Award and the Mid-America Bowling Writers Golden Quill Award.

"I have been blessed to be able to cover bowling competition at the highest level, to see the best players bowl in the most pressure-packaged situations, and to be able to talk to them and write about them is a privilege I've never taken lightly," Johnson said. "To be honored for the work I've done is really something I don't have the words to describe. If I was talking about someone else, I could describe it, but myself? Well, that's difficult."

## Red Pfeiffer – 4/16/1928 – 8/6/2018

Fred (Red) Pfeiffer, who did many things in his long life had one regret – he couldn't take his "cherry" 1969 Dodge Dart with him. Yes, he will miss all things bowling, his family and his dog - but, oh, that Dodge Dart. He published the Bowling World Newspaper for 24 years; emceed numerous Installations and other events; published the UABA Nor-Cal Junior Bowling Newspaper; a newsletter for ARC and California WBA's Golden Nugget for eight years. He was a sportscaster for a live show on Channel 42 and a sportscaster for KWNN-KKIS featuring bowling and Make Believe Ballroom as a DJ.

He did live bowling shows with "Whispering" Joe Wilson and was a radio announcer for the Miller Doubles Tournament at the MGM in Reno.

He founded the Rosy Duval Memorial Tournament benefitting the Bowling Hall of Fame for nearly 30 years netting nearly \$38,000. Red personally paid for dinner for all on the Celebrity squad. He was general manager of two bowling centers and among many other things including a serious injury from a 500 lb. piece of ice falling on him leaving him with a shattered knee and severely torn ligament and then, later, a heart attack. As he recovered he buried his pride and gave in to using a cane to walk safely. He was honored in three Halls of Fame. He leaves behind his wife Ruth and three children, Susan, Lisa and son Chris. His lifelong friend was Earl Anthony.
